



**Kansas City International Airport  
Landscape Master Plan**

JBC was retained to establish and implement the Master Plan objectives for future landscape development at KCI, which covers more than 7,000 acres. All aspects of the physical program were addressed in the site plan review process and development guidelines to assure a unified design expression in keeping with the distinctive prairie character of the airport site. As a special focus, more than 1,200 acres of native prairie grasses and wildflowers were established, which reduced grounds maintenance while promoting an ethic of public environmental stewardship.

Since the airport's opening in 1974, KCI officials have initiated programming and planning activities only as expansion occurred. Following the adoption of this Master Plan, JBC's role has been vital in ensuring that an innovative balance will exist between airport operations, grounds maintenance, public interests, and the natural environmental systems in all future expansion plans.
